

Clayton by a grant bearing date the first day of July One thousand seven hundred and ninety three Situate in Greenville District lying on the South side of Fortbenary Beaverdam Creek on both sides of Wild Cat branch, bounded as follows (Wth) Be-
 gining on a Lightwood Stake on land laid out to William Swift running thence S. 45 W. 67 chains & fifty links to a Chestnut thence S. 59 E. 10 chains to a Black Oak, thence N. 21 E. 18 chains to a Poison tree, thence down the several meanders of the Wild "Cat" branch to a Dogwood, thence South 60 E. 19 chains to a black Oak, thence N. 26 E. 43 chains to the beginning: Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining: To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Daniel Wilbanks his heirs and assigns forever. And I hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said Premises unto the said Daniel Wilbanks his heirs and assigns against myself & my heirs and against every Person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
