 60<sup>th</sup> W<sup>th</sup> of chains to a Stake 3<sup>rd</sup>, thence N. 30<sup>th</sup> W. 13<sup>th</sup>, 50 to  
 a Dogwood 3<sup>rd</sup> on Benj Arnold's line thence N. 60<sup>th</sup> E. 38<sup>th</sup>, 50  
 to a Red oak 3<sup>rd</sup> on David Traunum's line, thence S. 30<sup>th</sup> E.  
 13<sup>th</sup>, 75 to a Red Oak 3<sup>rd</sup> on John Thomas's line thence N. 60<sup>th</sup> W.  
 17<sup>th</sup> to a Red oak 3<sup>rd</sup>, thence S. 30<sup>th</sup> E. 3<sup>rd</sup>, 50 to a Red Oak 3<sup>rd</sup>, thence  
 S. to W<sup>th</sup> to the head of a branch, thence nearly on the same  
 direction along the Meanders of said branch to a White  
 Oak 3<sup>rd</sup> near its confluence with Horse Creek thence up  
 the Meanders of said creek to the beginning (being part  
 of a tract of Six hundred and forty acres of land originally  
 granted to Thomas Lewis) Together with all & singular  
 the Rights members hereditaments & appurtenances to the  
 said premises belonging or in any wise incident or  
 appertaining: To have and to hold all and singular  
 the said premises to the said W<sup>m</sup> Traunum his heirs and  
 assigns forever. And we do hereby bind ourselves  
 our heirs Executors & Administrators to warrant and  
 for ever defende all and singular the premises before  
 mentioned unto the said William Traunum to him  
 his heirs and assigns against ourselves & our heirs  
 & against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming  
 or to claim the same or any part thereof.
