Know all men by these presents that I John Jones of
Greenville District & State aforesaid in consider-
ation of the sum of six hundred & thirty two dollars to
be paid by Elias Earle of the District of Greenville
& State aforesaid have granted bargained sold and
released and by these presents do grant bargain sell
and release unto the said Elias Earle All that Tract
of Land where I now live containing one hundred & fifty
eight acres according to a Survey made the 3rd day
of March 1802 by George Salmon Esq. Deputy Surw^r
and being part of several surveys granted to Henry M.
Wood, Joseph Dunn & Isaac Brown, lying in the District
of Greenville on the West side of Cheehoan or North
fork of Saluda River. beginning at a Stake on the ~~bank~~
of the river & running S. 87 W. 10 chains 80 links to a
nash oak & thence S. 88 W. 21 chains to a post oak,
thence N. 98 W. 5 chains to the head of a branch, then
down the branch to a white oak on Wm. Grants land then
S. 16 W. 6, 50 to a black gum & thence S. 3 E. ~~7~~¹¹ 12 chains
to a dead pine, thence S. 60 E. 7. 90 then w. S. 11 chains
to a Stake, thence S. 62 E. 17. 50 to a dead red oak in
the head of the branch near Dobb's cabin, thence down
the meander of the branch to the River, then up the river
to the beginning Stake, containing one hundred and fifty
eight acres more or less. Together with all and singular
the premises Rights members hereditaments and appurtenan-
ces to the said premises belonging, or in any wise incident
