Carolina Greenville District, I Hudson Berry, a Justice of the Peace do hereby certify unto all whom it may concern that Nancy Crider wife of the within Daniel Crider did this day appear before me, and upon being privately and separately examined by me did declare that she does freely voluntarily and without any compulsion due or fear of any Person or Persons whom soever her name release and for ever relinquish unto the within named Iesse Parker his heirs and assigns all her Interest and Estate, & all her right & claim of dower of in or to all & singular the Premises within mentioned & released, given under my hand and seal this 23rd day of April 1803.

Know all men by these Presents that I Iesse Parker of the said District for & in consideration of two hundred dollars to me in hand paid by Hulst Sallvant of the State & District aforesaid, have granted, bargained sold & released, and by these Presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Hulst Sallvant, part of a tract of land originally granted to Mary Burns & part of a tract of land originally belonging to William Floyd, it lying and being between the Poplar bottom branch and horse Creek waters of Rudey River, begining on a Beach & on said branch, running S. 10. W. 25. ch. to a Stake corner, & thence N. 85. W. 10 ch. to a Sourwood, thence S. 70 W. 8 ch. to a Sweet gum on Horse Creek, thence S. 65. E. 21. ch. 15. link, down said Creek to a Poplar corner thence S. 61. E. 10 ch. 50 links, to a hickory corner, thence N. 5. E. 38 ch. to a Post Oak corner, thence S. 80 E. 34 ch. to a hickory corner on the head of a branch thence down S. branch N. 33. 15 ch. to a Stake corner on the Poplar bottom branch thence up S. branch with its meanders to the begining beach corner. Supposed to be one hundred and Sixty Seven acres more or less —

Together with all and singular the rights, members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said Premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining, & to have and to hold all & singular the Premises before mentioned unto the said Hulst Sallvant his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs and assigns, to warrant and for ever defend all and singular the said Premises unto the said Hulst Sallvant his heirs & assigns against myself and my and against every other person whatsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
