

State of South Carolina. Know all men by these Presents that I Charles
Gosnell of Greenville District in consideration of the sum of Eighty dollars
to me paid by Amos Ayres of the Dist^o afores^d. have granted bargained
sold and released and by these Presents do Grant bargain sell & release
unto the said Amos Ayres a Plantation or parcel of land laying
& being in the District afores^d. on the N^o fork of Vaughan's Creek of
N^o Pacolet River, beginning at a Spanish Oak & running thence
N^o 64 E. 13 ch. to a white Oak thence S^o 17 ch. to a Chestnut thence N^o
74 E. 12 ch. 50 links to a large Chestnut Oak thence S^o 5. W. to an
agreed corner a turkey Oak. & then thence to the mouth of the
Cocky Spurr branch thence up the branch to a pine thence S^o 38 W. to
a Stake, thence N. 23. ch. to the beginning Containing by estimation
Fifty Acres be the same more or less (the same being the upper end of
a Tract Containing One hundred and sixty six Acres, granted to
me by Patent bearing date 4th day of March 1793.) Together with
all and singular the Rights members hereditaments & appurtenances
thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining; to have & to hold
all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Amos
Ayres. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors & Administr^{rs}.
to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said Premises
unto the said Amos Ayres his heirs and assigns forever against
myself and my heirs, and against every Person whomsoever lawfully
claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. In Witness
whereof I have herunto set my hand and seal this Eighteenth day of
January In the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and
two, and twenty sixth year of American Independence.
