

South Carolina Greenville District. KNOW all men by these Presents that  
I Thomas Benson of Greenville District and State aforesaid for & in consideration  
of One hundred dollars to me in hand paid by Moses Bates of the District & State  
aforesaid the receipt is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained & sold &  
by these Presents do grant bargain & sell unto Moses Bates One hundred  
Acres of land out of a Tract of two hundred acres granted to Zachariah  
Blackwell "Junr." His at law to Daniel Blackwell Junr. bearing date  
the first day of August One thousand Seven hundred and Eighty five -  
Granted by his excellency William Moultrie Governor for the time  
being, which land was Conveyed from said Blackwell to John Tubb  
from Tubb to Benjamin Benson from him to Thomas Benson which will  
more fully appear by the Record, which land being and lying in the  
district aforesaid on the head waters of Enore river & bounded  
as followeth, Beginning on a Red Oak a corner of Bates & Blackwells  
land running thence N. 82. E. to a gum in a large Branch, thence  
continuing the same course to a Poplar on the Bank of a small  
Branch thence up the meanders of said branch to the head coming  
on a Poplar thence N. 74. E. to a Stake near the crop Paths, thence  
along the old paths to the ~~black oak~~ back line, thence down the  
line to Bates Stake corner, from thence to the Beginning containing  
One hundred Acres more or less: Together with all and singular the rights  
members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said Premises belonging or  
in any wise incident or appertaining, unto the said Moses Bates & his heirs  
forever. & I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors &c to warrant &  
for ever defend the above described Premises unto the said Bates against  
myself and my heirs, and against every other Person or Persons lawfully  
claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. In witness whereof  
I have set my hand and seal this 25 day October 1803
