Know all men by these Presents that we Ruben and Charity Tarrants of the State aforesaid and District of Pennington in consideration of the sum of eight hundred dollars, to us in hand paid by Leonard Tarrant of Greenville District and in the State aforesaid Planter, have granted bargained & sold & released, and by these Presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Leonard Tarrant, one certain Tract a Parcel of Land containing two hundred acres, be the same more or less, Situate lying and being in the district of Greenville in the State aforesaid on the East side of Saluda River and on both sides of the Golden Grove creek, being part of a Tract of three hundred acres originally granted to John Weyer, and was when granted bound to the N.W. on land land surveyed for Joseph Reid, to the N.E. on a late Survey of vacant land, to S.E. on land now belonging to William Smith & land of late Robert Maxwell, to the Westward & S. West on said Maxwell's and land surveyed for Thomas Callaway. and both such shape and marks as are fairly designated by a plat annexed to the original Grant which will fully and at large appear, reference being thereunto had;
