To have & to hold all and singular the premises above mentioned unto the s^d Thomas Early his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself & my heirs Executors & administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the s^d premises unto the said Thomas Early his heirs and assigns against myself & my heirs and against every person lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witnessestv that the said William Toney for the consideration of Two Hundred Dollars to him in hand, paid by the s^d Charles Benson the sum whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted and sold unto the said Charles Benson a certain tract of land situate in Greenville District on a branch of Saluda river it being part of a tract of land originally granted to John Hunt by his Excellency Charles Pinckney Esq^r the 4th day of June 1799 Beginning at a stone on the side of
