 I Thomas Edwards of the State and Dist aforesaid do bargain sell and release  
 unto William Miller a tract of Land lying in the State and District  
 aforesaid and on both sides of Kemps Branch of Enoree river containing  
 one hundred and Seventeen acres for and in the final sum of two  
 Hundred Dollars to him the said Edwards in hand paid beginning at a  
 White Oak thence on Leah Conners line west to a red oak thence  
 a cross Kemps branch at the mouth of a little branch and thence up  
 the East side of the branch to a small post oak thence East to a post oak on  
 Conroy land thence to the beginning corner the white oak together with all the  
 premises and appurtenances thereof I the sd Thomas Edwards do warrant and  
 defend my self my heirs assigns Executors and Administrators whomsoever  
 may claim challenge or demand unto William Miller his heirs and  
 assigns for ever to him and to hold the sd premises in writings my hand and  
 seal this the 30<sup>th</sup> December and in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and  
 Sixteen Just Mathew Hudson Edmund Miller Thomas <sup>his</sup> Edwards <sup>mark</sup>  
 South Carolina Greenville District personally came before me Edmund Miller and  
 after being duly sworn said that he was present and saw Tho<sup>s</sup> Edwards sign seal and deliver  
 this instrument of writing to William Miller as his act and deed for the use and purpose in mentioned and  
 that Mathew Hudson was a subscribing witness with him to the same sworn to and subscribed before me this third day of
