S. 32. W. 13 ch. To Po. 31 then S. 47. W. 18. ch. to pine stump Stump on branch of said creek then down the Meander of sd Creek to Po. 34. S. 38. E. 35. 50 to Po. 31 then S. 20. 75 to Stake 34 then S. 47. ch. To pine 34 S. E. 44. W. 8 ch. to pine 34 N. 34. W. 22. ch. R. 03 then N. 43. W. 14. 50 to R. 03 then 20 W. 450 to black Gum 34 due E. 6 to pine N. 04 E. 10. ch. to pine 34 N. 81 E. 6 ch. to R. 03 + N. 35 W. 3 ch to S. Gum on the bank of said creek then up the Meanders of sd Creek to the Beginning including two hundred and twenty one acres to the same more or less to gether we shall be singular the rights members hereditaments to the sd premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises above mentioned unto the said Joseph Edwards I do bear by hand myself my heirs Executors and Administrators and for ever defend unto the said Joseph Edwards his heirs and assigns for ever against myself myself and against every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 2nd of February 1818 signed and acknowledged before me
