The tract a parcel of Land containing Eighteen Acres conveyed from Silvan  
Miller to me. Begiting on a Spanish Oak running N 38° W 26.8 links to a  
Spanish Oak corner thence N 19° W 11.50 links to a maple corner thence S. 52.10  
5. chains to a red Oak corner thence S. 15° E 31.25. Links to a post Oak corner  
thence N 24° E 15.50 links to the beginning corner together with all and singular  
the rights and members Hereditaments and appertaining to the sd  
premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining to have and to hold  
all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the sd John Green  
his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my Heirs Executors  
and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the sd  
premises to the sd John Green his heirs and assigns against myself and my  
Heirs and against every other person or persons whatsoever lawfully claiming  
or to claim the same or any part thereof wheras witness my hand and Seal this  
the 24 of March one Thousand Eight Hundred and Seven by five Silvan Miller

State of Georgia This Indenture made this twenty eighth day of April  
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty six  
and in the fiftieth year of the Independence of the United States of  
America Between Thomas G. Walker of the county of Screven and State of  
Savannah of the first part and William T. Rowland of the District of  
Greenwill aud<sup>th</sup> State of South Carolina of the second part. Witnesseth  
that the said Thomas G. Walker for and in consideration of the sum of  
Three Thousand two hundred and fifty dollars to him in hand well  
and truly paid by the said William T. Rowland at or before the sealing  
and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged  
the said Thomas G. Walker hath granted bargained sold conveyed, remised  
and confirmed and by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell, convey, remise  
and confirm unto the said William T. Rowland and his Heirs forever all  
those four Lots, pieces, or parcels of Land situate lying and being in the  
Village of Greenwill in the State of South Carolina & known also distinguishing  
in a plan of said Village by the numbers Seventeen (17) Eighteen (18) Nineteen  
(19) and Twenty (20) upon which the said Thomas G. Walker formerly resided  
which said Lots were sold and conveyed by the said Thomas G. Walker to  
Oliver M. Lillibridge of Savannah Georgia and the said Oliver M. Lillibridge  
having failed to pay to the said Thomas G. Walker the consideration therefor  
the said Oliver M. Lillibridge and Maria Lillibridge his wife on the
