Know all men by these presents that Daniel Pike of Greenville in the state aforesaid in consideration of fifty eight dollars to me paid by Doctor William Butler of Greenville District in the state aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Dr. William Butler all that certain tract piece or parcel of land situated lying and being in the District of Greenville and State aforesaid on the head waters of Laurel Creek waters of Reedy River including part of Pikes Mountain, beginning at a chestnut corner near the road leading to said mountain and running thence fifty five chains till it intersects the old line of Mrs. Pikes tract S. 80. E thence S. 54. E 5 ch. 60. links to a Spanish Oak corner, thence S. 74. W. 26 ch. to a pine thence N. 81. W. 20 ch. to a Post Oak thence N. 46. W. 22. ch. to a red oak and thence N. 31. E three chains to the beginning corner containing fifty eight acres be the same more or less and being a part of of a tract originally platted for 105 acres but on a recalculation found to contain one hundred and three acres. Together with all and singular the Rights, Members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises係ancing or in any wise incident or appertaining to have and to hold, all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Doctor William Butler his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself and my heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant and for ever defend, all and singular the said premises, unto the said Doctor William Butler and his heirs and assigns against my self and my heirs and against every other person or persons lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof Witness my hand and seal this thirtieth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty six and in the fifty first year of the independence of the United States of America.
