as our act and deed to sign seal execute and deliver such deed and
Conveyances for the absolute sale or disposal thereof or any part thereof with such
blanks, covenants or agreements to be therein contained as our said attorneys William
D. Bradford and Lemuel J. Bradford Executors of the Estate of Philemon Br-
adford deceased shall think fit and convenient hereby ratifying and
confirming all such deeds, Conveyances, bargains and sales which shall at
any time hereafter be made by our said attorneys touching or concer-
ning the premises &c Given under our hands and seals this the four-
teenth day of September Anno Domini 1826.
