Greenville District State and district aforesaid for & in consideration of thirty  
dollars to me in hand paid by Joseph Roberts of said State and district aforesaid  
have granted bargained and sold & by these presents do grant bargain sell & release  
unto the said Joseph Roberts twenty acres of land more or less out of the tract left  
me by my Father William Chandler Beginning on a white oak on the N. side  
of the Sampit branch on the said Joseph Roberts line thence Northward to a post  
Oak on James Hooker line thence west said line Northward to a pine near the  
road thence with said road westerly to Master Ayres corner on a hickory thence  
southerly with the original to the same pit branch thence with the meanders of  
said Branch to the beginning together with all & singular the rights members  
hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise  
incident or appertaining to have & to hold all and singular the premises  
before mentioned unto the said Joseph Roberts his heirs and assigns for ever  
& I do hereby bind myself my heirs & executors administrators to warrant and  
defend the above mentioned premises from myself my heirs and executors  
&c Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the thirty first day of Decem  
ber in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty one signed  
Sealed and delivered in presence of Jas H. Gilchrist, James Hooker Joseph Chandler
