E. 24. to a stake 3^x three 1.55 E 37. to a red oak 3^x bounded on Arnold's land
three 1.47 W. 40. to a stake 3^x bounded on L. Allin's land three N. 43 E. 24.
to a maple 3^x bounded on the late Sammons land and from thence to the
beginning to have and to hold all and singular the premises before
mentioned unto the said Benjamin Arnold his heirs and assigns for ever
and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and administrators to
warrant and forever defend all and singular the premises before men-
tioned unto the said Benjamin Arnold his heirs and assigns against my
self and my heirs and against every other person or persons whomsoever
lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof Witness my hand
and seal this the ninth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hun-
dred and twenty five but Joseph Sullivan Pleasant Shaw, Henry Burrow E. S.
