South Carolina To all to whom these presents shall come, I, Nimrod Underwood Sheriff of Greenville district, and state aforesaid, send greeting:  
Whereas by virtue of three writs of fieri facias, issued out of the Court of Common pleas, held for the district of Greenville tested the first manday, after the 4th Manday in March & in October in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and twenty one & twenty six at the suits of Jeremiah Cleveland and Thompson M. Prince to me directed commanding me, that of the goods and chattels, lands and tenements of Joseph Turner to levy the sum of Eight hundred and Eighty two dollars & 15 cents with damages and costs I have seized and taken of the lands and tenements of the said Joseph Turner all that certain piece parcel and tract of land containing two hundred and Eighty acres more or less Situate and being in the district of Greenville and State aforesaid on Hooper Creek of Saluda River; Beginning on a red oak on Farm line thence N. 78. 10. 60 ch to a hickory thence N. 22. 10. 17 ch to a small red oak thence N. 42. 5. 22 ch to a red oak on Isaac Bradbys line thence N. 53. E. 32 ch to a red oak thence N. 41. E. 12 ch. to a Red Oak near the mill Post thence S. 13. E. 7 ch to a post Oak thence S. 10 E. 19 ch 90 links to a pine stump thence S. 80.
