 to us paid by Philip Bushop of the said State and district aforesaid have  
 granted bargained sold, and released and by these presents do grant bargain  
 sell and release unto the said Philip Bushop a plantation and tract of  
 Land lying in the State and district aforesaid on the branches of the Rocky  
 fork of the Golden Grove Creek water of ~~Savannah~~ <sup>Savannah</sup> River it being part  
 or tract of Land that was granted to the said Samuel Williams and Micajah  
 Berry on the seventh day of September one thousand eight hundred and  
 Twelve and recorded in Grant Book F No 7 Page 343. Beginning on a red oak  
 3x thence running N.E. 10.84 to a red oak 3x bounded by Robert Maxwell and  
 thence East 7.60 to a Pine 3x thence South 37.50 to a red oak 3x bounded by  
 Seaborn's land, thence S.W. 7.37 to a stake 3x bounded by Paulen Cannon's land  
 thence S.W. 65.19 to the beginning Bounded on Hewlet-Sullivan's Land includ-  
 -ing a part of the plantation which the said Bushop now lives with one  
 hundred and four Acres of Land be the same more or less Together with  
 all and singular the rights muniments and appurtenances to the said  
 premises belaning or in any wise incident or appertaining to have and  
 to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said  
 Philip Bushop his heirs and assigns forever And we do hereby bind  
 ourselves our heirs Executors and administrators to warrant and forever  
 all and singular the said premises unto the said Philip Bushop his and  
 assigns against our selves and our heirs and against every person whom-  
 -soever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof —
