E to a poplar 3x on the Spring branch thence down the said branch or near the branch to Mountain Creek thence up said Creek to the old original line to the line of Abner Cox thence on the line of said Coxes line to a Stake the beginning together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or pertaining to have and to hold all and singular the said premises unto the said Joseph McCullough his heirs or assigns for ever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors administrators to warrant and forever defend the said premises unto the said Joseph McCullough his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs and against every other person who =ansover lawfully or to claim the same or my part thereof witness my hand and seal this 4th of January One thousand Eight hundred and twenty eight and in the fifty second year of the Independence of the United States of America signed sealed and delivered in the presence of Kindred Bagwell, William H. Stone, Stephen Stone ^{Seal}

Know all men by these presents that I Jonathan Stone of the State and district aforesaid in Consideration of one hundred and fifty dollars to me paid by Stephen Stone of the State and district aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant her gain sell and release unto the said Stephen Stone a plantation or tract of land containing Seventy seven acres be the same more or less situated in Greenville District on Mountain Creek waters of Saluda River being part of a tract of land formerly belonging to Jonathan Stone Senr. decd beginning on a Stake on the line of the original Survey running thence N. 82 E 9.50 to a hickory 3x thence N. 61. E to a poplar 3x thence N. 4. E 11. to a oak 3x thence N. 83. E 13.26. to a red Oak 3x thence S. 13. E 2. 9. 4. to red oak 3x N. 80. E 7. to a black gum on mountain Creek bounding on Stephen Stone line thence up the meanders said Creek to an oak 3x on the line of the original Survey thence on the lines of the first Survey to the beginning together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or pertaining to have and to hold all and singular
