S. B. Rutledge his heirs & assigns for ever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors, administrators & assigns to warrant and for ever defend the right of said land to D. S. B. Rutledge his heirs Executors, administrators and assigns against myself, my heirs Executors, administrators and assigns or against any other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof as witness my hand and seal this the seventh day of February Eighteen hundred and twenty eight - signed sealed and delivered in the presence of us Jope Moon, Thaddeus Farmer, S.
