 bers hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in  
 any wise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and sin-  
 gular the premises before mentioned unto the said Joseph McCullough his  
 heirs and assigns for ever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and  
 administrators to warrant and for ever defend all and singular the above named  
 premises unto the said Joseph McCullough his heirs and assigns against  
 myself my heirs and against every other person or persons lawfully claiming  
 the same or any part thereof Witness my hand and seal this 5<sup>th</sup> day of Janu-  
 ary One thousand Eight hundred and twenty eight and in the fifty
