 Greenville District } - rant of the District and State aforesaid, for and
 in consideration of the sum of three hundred dollars to me in hand paid by
 May George Seaborn of the said State and district, the receipt whereof is hereby
 acknowledged, Have granted bargained sold released, conveyed and confirmed
 and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell release convey and confirm unto the said
 George Seaborn and his heirs, one sixth part of a tract of land whereon my Father
 Benjamin Tarrant lived and died, adjoining lands of Robert Maxwell, Leonard Tarrant
 John Charles, and Willis Benson on the Golden Grove in the district of Greenville afo-
 -said containing three hundred and twenty acres more or less to have and to
 hold the said sixth part of the said tract of land together with all and singular
 or the rights, members Hereditaments and appurtenances to the said land belonging or
 in any wise appertaining when divided among the heirs of the said Benjamin
 -in Tarrant my Father and in the said division the said George Seaborn
 is hereby authorized and empowered to claim & sue for partition in my
 name and in all things relating to the said tract of land to represent me and
 take my share thereof as fully as I could have done had this conveyance
 not been made; and should it be necessary to sell the said tract of land
 to demand & receive all and singular the portion or part that may
 be coming to me as one of the said heirs, and I do hereby bind myself and
 my heirs Executors & Administrators to warrant and for ever defend the said
 sixth part of the said tract of land unto the said George Seaborn & his
 heirs for ever against me and my heirs and against any other person
 claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof Witness my hand
 and seal this 12th day of August A.D. 1826. Signed sealed and deliv-
