the State of South Carolina Greenville District on the waters of
Brushy Creek beginning on a chesnut at or near Williams mulecuff
line running thence S. to the head of a small branch: thence down
said branch to brushy creek: the conditional line between Constant
and Wesley Plumley thence up said creek to the East boundary line
thence N. to a hickory: thence to Williams mulecuff line thence with
said line west to the beginning containing one hundred and fifty
acres more or less to have and to hold unto the said Jonson Bain
his heirs administrators and assigns for ever all that piece, par-
cel of land to have and to hold unto the said free from all
other person or persons unto said Bain mines, minerals and apper-
tenances there belong: to the use and benefit of said Bain and his
heirs for ever free from all claims of any other person or persons
claiming the same or any part the plantation where David Gar-
ren now resides conveyed from Jacob Frankes to Constant Plum-
ley from Constant Plumley to Jonson Bain in witness whereof
I Constant Plumley have this day set my hand and seal

State of South Carolina: Know all men by these presents that Matthew
Hudson of Greenville District in the State aforesaid in consideration
of twenty five dollars paid by Pleasant Hudson of Greenville District and
State aforesaid: the said Matthew Hudson have granted, bargained, sold
and released and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release
unto the said Pleasant Hudson a plantation or tract of land con-
taining one acre and twenty five rods, including a spring lying in
the district and State aforesaid: on both sides of Rocky Creek the waters of
Inovee River it being a part of a tract of land originally granted to
Abraham Hudson, whereas on a stake corner on S. Hudsons line run-
ning from thence N. 10 W. 46 rods to a May pole corner S. 80. W. 4 rods to a
stake corner S. 10 E. 46 rods to a hickory corner N. 80 E. 4 rods to the begin-
