

Eli Bauldin the following negroes Viz, one negro girl Phillis about twenty years old one other girl Nancy (Daughter of Phillis) about ten years old one other boy Major about fifteen years old which said negroes the rights whereof I do warrant and ever defend unto the said Eli Bauldin his heirs and assigns &c against me my heirs &c or any other person lawfully claiming or to claim the whole or any part of them as witness my hand and seal this 7 day of March 1832

The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound Nathaniel Dacus should pay or cause to be paid unto the above mentioned Eli Bauldin the aforesaid note together with all the costs that he may incur by collecting the same then and in that case the above obligation shall be nul and void otherwise to remain in full force and virtue as witness my hand and seal this day and date above mentioned

Know all men by these presents that we Reynolds Dill and Sarah Dill both of Greenville District and State aforesaid for and Inconsideration of one hundred dollars to us paid by John Dunahoo of Hall County and State of Georgia have Granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do Grant bargain sell and release unto the said John Dunahoo <sup>John Dunahoo</sup> ~~John Dunahoo~~ a certain tract or parcel of Land situate lying and being in the district aforesaid on the South side of South Siger River adjoining of lands belonging to Joseph McMillion Joseph Chastain and Joseph Barrett Beginning on a white oak on the bank of the River thence on Joseph Barrett line to a stake corner thence on Arthurs Barretts line to a white oak corner thence on a Conditional line to a post oak corner on Chastains line thence along said line to a red oak thence on McMillions line to a spanish oak on the bank of the river thence up the meanders of the River to the beginning corner containing one hundred and fifty acres more or less it being a tract of Land that David Dunahoo was legally seized and possessed of in fee simple at the time of his death and the said Sarah Dill being his widow fell in possession of the third part of the said tract of Land as her dower which said third part of said tract of Land is intended by these presents to be conveyed to the said John Dunahoo Together with all and singular the Rights members Hereditaments and appertainances to the said premises belonging or the third part thereof as aforesaid or in any wise incident to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned that is the third part unto the said John Dunahoo his heirs and assigns
