 sum of Five Hundred Dollars to me in hand paid by John W. Hansell
 of the State and District aforesaid, have bargained, sold and released
 and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said John
 W. Hansell all that plantation or tract of Land containing Two Hundred
 and Forty acres, be the same more or less, situate and lying in Greenville
 District on Needy River bounding as follows viz. beginning on a P. O.
 corner on Reuben Masters line thence said line to a Gum Station on the branch
 thence to a stake, thence a conditional line made by John Phillips and
 David Lovel to a white Oak corner on Vernons line, thence Vernons
 line to a P. O. corner, thence Vernons line to a P. O. corner on said
 Hansells line, thence Hansells line to a gum on a branch, thence down
 the meanders of said branch to Needy River, thence down the meanders
 of the River to the mouth of a branch, thence up the meanders of said
 branch to Thurston's Black Gum corner, thence Thurston's line to Masters
 Red Oak corner, thence Masters line to the beginning - Together with
 all the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said
 premises belonging or in any wise appertaining to have and to hold
 all and singular the premises abovementioned unto the said John W.
 Hansell, his heirs and assigns forever - and I do hereby bind myself
 my heirs, executors, and administrators to warrant and forever defend
 all and singular the said premises unto the said John W. Hansell
 his heirs and assigns against myself, my heirs and every other person
 whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof
 as witness my hand and seal this 19th day of September 1818.
