

112 One acre one from David Johnson dated ninth day of December one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine (1829) for one hundred and twelve acres (112) and one from Charles Bruce dated the thirtieth day of January one thousand eight hundred and thirty (1830) of two small fractions containing nearly two and a half acres the whole containing about three three hundred and eighty five and a half acres and is bounded as follows (viz) Beginning at a sweet gum on the bank of the river there S. 5. W. 34 With Cleveland's line to a stone corner on the bank of the creek there to a red oak corner continuing a straight line thence to a hickory corner on Johnson's line thence S. 18 $\frac{1}{2}$  E. on Cleveland's line to a stone corner thence S. 56 W. 9. 00 to a pine thence N. 63. W. 6. 20 to a pine thence N. 63 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 12. 50 to a black gum thence N. 46 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 12. 50 to a black oak thence N. 34 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 16. 40 to a chestnut thence S. 85. W. 1. 40 to a sweet gum thence N. 25. W. 2 to a white oak thence N. 36. W. 12. 00 up the hollow nearly straight to a white oak thence S. 87. W. to a hickory corner thence 4. W. 3 chains to a stone corner thence S. 87. W. 3 chains 58 links to a stone corner thence S. 4. W. 2 chains 90 links to B. & C. corner on the said road and then S. 69 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. along the said road one chain and fifty links to a pine thence N. 4. W. to a white oak at the head of a branch thence down the meanders of the branch nearly to the river but striking the river a little above the mouth of the branch as the fence runs thence down the river with all its meanders to the beginning corner together with all land singular the rights members heretofore appertaining thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said P. E. Duncan his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators and assigns to warrant and will forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said P. E. Duncan his heirs and assigns against me and my heirs and assigns and against each and every other person lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof witness my hand and seal this the seventh day of November one thousand eight hundred and thirty one and in the fifty sixth year of the independence of the united states of America signed sealed and delivered
