Greenville District } Executed his last Will and Testament and appointed John C.  
Sullivan Thomas J. Sullivan and George W. Sullivan Executors thereof and departed  
this life, and Whereas in and by the provisions of the said Will the said Testator  
directed that certain Lands therein Specified should be laid off in convenient lots  
and divided among and Between six Children to wit; Elizabeth Jefferson Charles  
Polly Washington and James Now therefore know all men by these presents that we  
John C. Sullivan Thomas J. Sullivan and George W. Sullivan Executors aforesaid of the  
district aforesaid for the purpose of carrying into Execution the Intentions of the  
said Testator for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty hundred & Seventy  
dollars to us Received for in consequence of the said Will by James M. Sullivan one  
of the devisees aforesaid as part of his Legacy aforesaid have Granted and Released  
and by these presents do grant and Release as Executors aforesaid unto the said James  
M. Sullivan all that plantation or tract of land lying on Horse Creek containing  
five hundred and ninety four acres be the same more or less Beginning at a large  
Black oak 3x thence N. 40. W. 43. 50 to a post oak 3x thence S. 50. W. 30 chains to a  
Water oak 3x on the creek and down the same about 22 chains to a Stake 3x S. 50  
W. 20. chains to a chestnut at Rapp's Gate thence S. 24. E. 21. 50 to a large Black oak  
thence N. 30. E. 10. to a black oak 3x thence S. 82. E. 48 to a sassafras 3x thence S. 15. W.  
10. to a sweet gum in mill pond thence S. 68. E. 10. to a maple 3x thence S. 56 E. 25 to  
an arched oak 3x thence N. to an arched oak 3x thence S. to a stake on the mill Road 3x  
thence down the said creek about S. 66. E. 23 to a post oak or Hickory 3x thence N. 24  
E. 28. 50 to a post oak near the Junction of two Branches 3x thence down the same  
to a maple 3x on the poplar Bottom Branch thence up the same to the Beginning  
Together with all and singular the rights members Hereditaments and appur-  
tainances to the said premises Belonging or in any wise Incident or appertaining  
to have and to hold all and singular the said premises unto the said James M.  
Sullivan his heirs and assigns for ever and we do hereby as Executors aforesaid
