E. 25. Chains to a Spanish Oak Thence running up the meanders of the Creek to the Mouth of the Branch on the North side of Brush Creek thence up the said Branch with Richard Pops land to the original line thence running with the original line to a Red oak Thence S. 21 Chains 51 Links to a Stake on the Creek Thence down with the meanders of the Creek to the mouth of the Branch on the South side of the Creek Thence up the said Branch to the head
