Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in any wise incident or appertaining - To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said George F. Townes his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself, my heirs, executors, administrators, to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said George F. Townes his heirs and assigns against me and my heirs and against all persons lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this the twenty second day of April in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight hundred and thirty nine and in the sixtieth year of the Independence of the United States of America. "The word, having such shape as the plat hereunto annexed interlined before signing" Signed sealed and delivered in the presence of John A. Townes William A. Townes Henry Paris South Carolina Personally came W. A. Townes before me and made oath Greenville District that he saw Henry Paris sign seal and deliver the within deed of conveyance to Geo F. Townes for the use and purposes therein mentioned, and that John A. 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South Carolina I know all men by these presents that I Williams Butler Greenville District of the District and State aforesaid do hereby relinquish Elijah Pitts of said State and district all right claim or title I have to a certain piece of land situate in said district on the waters of Laurel creek to him his heirs and assigns forever. The said land is a part of a tract of land conveyed to me by Daniel Pitts originally granted to John Connor but the part now to be relinquished being "Carved" by an older original grant to John Goodwin - The said relinquishment is bounded as follows - beginning at a pine corner on or near the upper original line of said Goodwins survey thence S 4 E to a gum corner at the head of a branch thence down said branch to a hickory corner at the fork thence N 50 W until it intersects the above mentioned Goodwins line at a stake corner in an old field, thence N 60 E 44 ch. to the beginning pine corner containing forty acres by estimation - Witness my hand and seal the 2d day of Feb 1829 sealed & filed in my office at the office of the Water S. J. Wm. B. the P.P.
