 to a Rock 3<sup>rd</sup> thence S 44<sup>th</sup> E to a Red Oak sitting 3<sup>rd</sup> thence W 13<sup>th</sup> to a stake 3<sup>rd</sup> thence S 82<sup>th</sup>  
 to the beginning. Together with all & singular the Rights Member Here defined & by  
 appointment to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining  
 to have & to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said  
 John Harrison his heirs & assigns forever and we do hereby bind myself my heirs  
 & administrators & no further to warrant & forever defend all & singular the said  
 premises unto the said John Harrison his heirs & assigns against myself & no further lawfully  
 claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof witness our hands and seal this  
 Ninth day of February in the Year of our Lord in the Year Eighteen Hundred and  
 Thirty One & in the fifty fifth Year of American Independence a. d. 1832.

 given granted and confirmed and by these presents do give grant and confirm  
 unto the said William J. Prince a negro boy by the name of Pleasant about  
 eight years old to have and to hold and enjoy the said named boy as his  
 property forever. And I the said Thomson Barrott do warrant and defend the above  
 mentioned boy against myself my heirs Executors and Administrators & all and  
 every other person or persons whomsoever - In witness whereof I have hereun-  
 to set my hand and seal this 3<sup>rd</sup> day of July 1839. Signed in presence of  
 us Joseph Barton, John Russell, A. G. Powers } Thomson Barrott

 Greenville District } and duly made oath that he was present and saw Thomson Barrott  
 sign seal and acknowledge the within deed of gift to William J. Prince for the use  
 and purpose in it mentioned and that John Russell & A. G. Powers were subscribing  
 witnesses with himself to the due execution of the same - Sworn to and subscribed
