


A 22 6/27 chain to a stake near the edge of an old field, thence N 65 W 5  
 chains to a Pine, thence N 33 W 29 ch. 50 links to a Hickory near the forks  
 of a small Branch, thence nearly with the Branch S 89 W 16 chain to a  
 Stump, Heumon corner, thence with his line S 35 E 47 ch 25 to a stake  
 near a small, thence S 22 W 10 chain to a stake on the bank of the river  
 thence with the river as it meanders to the beginning containing by es-  
 timation fifty three acres, be the same more or less. To have and to hold  
 all and singular the premises, above mentioned unto the said James  
 Heumon, and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors Adminis-  
 trators and assigns, to warrant and defende the above mentioned prem-  
 ises unto the said James Heumon his heirs & assigns against me my heirs  
 and against every other person or persons, whomsoever lawfully claim-  
 ing or to claim the same or any part thereof in Witnesp whereof I have  
 hereunto set my hand & seal this 14<sup>th</sup> day of September in the year  
 of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred & thirty nine.

 Greenville District } Newton Bramblett for and in consideration  
 of Four Hundred and Thirty four Dollars paid to me by Thomas  
 Harrison have granted bargained sold and released and by  
 these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto Thomas Harrison  
 all that tract or parcel of land, containing One Hundred & Eighty  
 three acres, being part of a tract of Land, granted to Caleb  
 Kimball the 22<sup>nd</sup> January 1794 conveyed from him to George  
 Welch, from George Welch, thence from him to Daniel Welch thence  
 to J. N. Welch, thence to Newton Bramblett situated in the District  
 of Greenville on the waters of Naberss Creek of Rudy River and  
 waters of ~~the~~ Creek of Anoree River, recorded in grants Book  
 O. N 5 page 484 beginning on a Pine thence W. 64 to a Hickory  
 passing two stations, a Maple and Red Oak from the Hickory N. 17.50  
 to a Pine, thence S. 60 E 10 to a Red Oak, thence N 30. E 30 to a stake  
 passing a Red Oak station, thence S. 64 E 26.50 to a stake, thence  
 S. 74 E 13.50 to a stake, thence S. 10 E 24 to the beginning Pine
