 in hand paid by Mr. McNeely of State and district aforesaid  
 have granted bargained and sold to the said Mr. McNeely  
 a certain plantation or tract of land containing seventy one  
 Acres lying in the State and district aforesaid on the South  
 side of Durbin's Creek a part of the tract originally granted  
 to Emanuel York beginning at a Water Oak on said  
 Creek running S. 33 $^{\circ}$  W. 16 to a Post Oak thence S. 57 $^{\circ}$  E. 48 to a stone  
 thence N. 35 $^{\circ}$  E. 21.50 links to a poplar on said creek thence up the  
 meanders of said creek to the Beginning which includes the  
 above quantity of land conveyed to the said McNeely his
