

Know all men by these presents that I William Taylor of the State of South Carolina and Green District do for and in Consideration of the Natural love and affection I do bear towards my son Randal Taylor of the state and district aforesaid have granted given released and made over and by these presents do give grant release and make over unto the said Randal Taylor all that Tract or parcel of Land supposed to contain fifty acres more or less. Situate in Greenville District and State aforesaid on the Waters of Camp Branch. beginning On a Maple Corner. On ^{said} Branch joining Aaron Howell thence with said line to a Stake on Dudley Howell's line thence with said line to Joseph Edwards line thence with said line to a Stake Corner thence with said Edwards and John Andrews line to Chestnut Corner thence down the meanders of the branch to the beginning Corner Together with all and singular the rights members Hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining - To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Randal Taylor his heirs and assigns forever I do bind myself my heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto Randal Taylor against myself my heirs and every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming the same or any part thereof In witness I have hereunto set my hand and my affixed seal this 21st day of December 1838 and in the sixty second year of American Independence of America Signed Sealed and delivered in the presents of Absalom Carney W^m Carney } William Taylor Seal
