 branch; thence up said branch to my back line thence with John
 Harris line to James Harris line; thence with James Harris line to
 the beginning - it being part of a tract of land Conveyed by
 Jeremiah Cleveland to myself containing one hundred and Twenty
 five acres more or less - To Have and to Hold all and
