Hundred Dollars to me in hand paid by G. F. Towns
comt in Equity for Greenville District the receipt of
which is hereby acknowledged have bargained sold gran-
-tated and released and by these presents do grant
bargain sell and release to the said G. F. Towns, comt
in Equity aforesaid and to his successors in office the
following tract of land situate lying and being in
Greenville district and State aforesaid on the head
branch of South Tyger River at the foot of Rat Moun-
-tain ³²⁶ adjoining lands now owned by David Jackson
called the Mountain beginning on a Post Oak corner
