David Terry Deed of sale for 3 Tracts of Land ⁶⁵¹

To John Hightower State of South Carolina. Know all men

by these presents that I David Terry of the District of Greenville and State aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of Four Hundred Dollars to me in hand paid by John Hightower of the District of Greenville and State aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said John Hightower all that tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the District of Greenville in the State aforesaid on the West fork of the Beavertan Creek Waters of the North Fork of Saluda River being a part of three or four surveys the first being a tract or part of a tract of land originally granted to Martin Adams and conveyed from S^r Adams to Edward Stringer and from said Stringer to Philip Davis and from said Davis to David Terry and bounded as follows viz. Beginning on a White Oak corner on the N.W. side of the River running thence on S 6 to a Stake thence N 34 W 40 Chains to a White Oak corner thence S 56 E 25 ch^t to a White Oak corner thence to a Stake N 34 E 40 to a White Oak thence on to the Beginning containing One Hundred Acres be the same more or less, secondly a tract or parcel of land containing Fifty acres be the same more or less on the same Waters of the above tract. Beginning on a Hickory corner running N 56 W 8 ch^t to a White Oak corner thence S 34 W 40 ch^t to a Mountain Oak corner thence a straight line to a conditional pine corner on the back line thence N 34 E to the beginning it being part of a tract of land granted to John Moore and conveyed to Philip Davis by said Moore and conveyed by said Davis to David Terry. Thirdly the tract or parcel of land purchased by Philip Davis of Thomas M^r Caswell containing One Hundred acres on the said Waters and adjoining the above described lands and conveyed by said Davis to David Terry and hath such boundaries as follows Beginning on a branch the said Davis lies on the South side of the Creek on a conditional White Oak corner thence a straight line to the head of the first branch that
