-ts that I John Lucas of Spartanburg District and State afores-
-said for and in consideration of the sum of Four Hundred doll-
-ars to me in hand paid by William Harrison of Greenville have
granted bargained sold and released and by these presents
do grant bargain sell and release unto the said William Harrison
a certain tract or parcel of land situate in the District of
Greenville & State aforesaid on both sides of Wildcat creek waters
of South Tyger River beginning on a white oak on the North side
of said Wildcat Creek thence a straight line to the top
of Pop Mountain to a chestnut oak thence from the top of
the Mountain a straight line to a Post oak conditional
corner near the old road thence to a Pine stump standing
in the Gap Camps Road conditional thence nearly a straight line
across said ^{Wildcat} Creek to a Hickory thence back across said creek
