deceased and in consideration of the sum of Five hundred thousand dollars
to us no more than \$500000 secured to be paid by Samuel H. Garrison
and B. H. Garrison also heirs at law of the said B. H. Garrison deceased
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. We have granted, bargained
sold released and conveyed and by these presents do grant, bargain
sell release and convey unto the said Samuel H. Garrison and B. H.
Garrison and their heirs forever all and singular the free lands
of land herein after described part of which are situated lying and being
in the District of Greenville and State aforesaid The first tract con-
tains from hundreds and eighteen acres more or less lies on the south
of Saluda River and Goldin Grove Creek Beginning at a Black
Gum on Saluda River where it is bounded by John Payne land
and running Thence S 81° E 74° chains to a small Sorrel wood Thence
N 74° W 20° to a pine Thence N 73° E 24° to a post Oak Thence down
a branch tree to a sweet Gum Thence N 74° E 35° to a black Gum
Thence N 45° E 12° 50' to a Stake on a branch Thence down said
branch to a white oak Thence S 25° E 16° to a Spanish oak thence
S 46° W 38° to a Stake on the Petersburg Road Thence N 34° W 24° 55' to
a Stake Thence S 44° W 33' to a Hickory Thence N 46° W 23° 40' to a
Stake Thence N 81° E 40' to a Stake on Saluda River Thence up
said River to the beginning corner, being the same tract of land
that G. F. Evans as Commissary in Equity for Greenville District
conveyed to William Wrightman by deed bearing date the 4th December
1839 and by the said William Wrightman conveyed to the said B. H.
Garrison deceased by deed dated the Twenty Third day of March
1839 as will appear by reference to the said deeds and plats. Wherefore am
