sum of Two Hundred Dollars to us in hand paid by Joseph W Green of the District  
and State aforesaid have bargained, granted, sold and released unto the  
purchaser do bargains, Grant sell and release a certain tract or parcel of land  
situate in the District and State aforesaid on a branch of Pines Creek bounded  
on one side by a branch of Cane Creek containing One hundred and thirty nine acres more or less  
being a part of a tract of land known as the White Horse Tract conveyed by  
John S Butler to said Wm. Originally granted to George Sanders

Beginning at a stone near the Buncome road, running S 64°  
W 11.62 chs N 100 rods S 45° 44' W 48.58 chs to a P. O. stone then S 64°
