So to Robert Mason George 13 Part  
John J. McNamee Power & William H. Brown of Green county  
in the State of Tennessee. Greeting

To know & that in consideration of your integrity and skill, full power  
is hereby given to you to take the depositions of Mary Powell wife  
of Joseph Powell of Greenville District in the state of South Carolina  
of her power & power in the premises described in the doc from Joseph  
Powell to John J. McNamee dated the 31<sup>st</sup> day of October one thousand  
and eight hundred and fifty four conveying a certain lot of Land being  
and being in the village of Greenville containing on half acre more  
or less adjoining the lot of Henry Glenn on a street running down  
from the Episcopal Church towards the river and immediately oppo-  
site to John Street's lot. Beginning at a rock corner of said lot  
Glenn's and running up said street forty seven feet more or less to  
the fence adjoining the porch of the house where Ed. Lammie now  
lives thence in a direct line across said lot, then hundred feet  
to another suit to York Wadday, Thomkeen's lot, thence down said street  
forty seven feet to a rock corner on said Glenn's line, thence along said  
line three hundred feet to the beginning.

For this purpose you will cause the said Mary Powell to  
appear before you and you will examine her separately, and severally  
apart from all other persons, and if upon such examination she shall  
say declare that she doth so voluntarily and without any compul-  
sion do it or fear of any person or persons whomsoever, doth now  
release and forever relinquish to John J. McNamee his & his, an assign-  
ees all her interest and estate and also all her right and claim of power  
of in or to all and singular the premises described and conveyed in the doc  
of record.

Then you shall take under her hand a certificate of her conno-  
ciation as aforesaid in the form of a declaration upon private examina-  
tion as aforesaid, which certificate authenticated by your hands and  
seals of you shall annex to this writ. And having certified under your hands and  
seals the due execution of this writ and verified the same by the oath of  
one of you, before some magistrate who is authorized by the laws of your  
state to administer oaths and whose official signature may be prop-  
erly authenticated you shall carefully return this writ together with your  
proceedings therein to the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas and  
General Sessions for Greenville District in the state aforesaid to be  
duly recorded. Herein jail not.
