District our State aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of Two Thous-
and One Hundred and Thirty five dollars to us in hand paid or to come to
the parts of Sister H. Garrison the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have
granted, bargained sold released and conveyed And by these presents doth grant
bargain, sell release and convey unto the said Sister H. Garrison and his heirs
forever all and singular the one third part of two tracts of land hereinafter
described lying and being in the District of Granville and State aforesaid
Tract No 1 Lying on the West Side of the Golden Grove Creek waters
of Saluda River the same being a part of a tract of Land Originally
Granted to Henry Pendleton Esq for Six hundred and forty acres more
or less and is bounded by lands belonging to C. F. Garrison & Charles
D. Whittles lands of the estate of J. Richardson and Captain Westfield
Beginning at a Stake and running thence N^E 46° E 44 ch to a Walnut Tree
S 43 1/2 E 61 chains to the Grove Creek thence down with the meanders of
said Creek to the mouth of a ditch 34.77 chains thence S 44° W 14.50 to
a large White Oak and thence N^E 44° E West 86.30 to the beginning
