have bargained and sold unto Jesse Center a tract or parcel of Land for in consideration of ^{one} hundred and forty dollars to me in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereof acknowledged, and by these presents do have bargained and sold and released and confirmed unto the said Jesse Center his heirs executors administrators and assigns forever, a certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the aforesaid District of Greenville on the waters of South Paces known by the name of Cross Creek, being a part of a tract of Land laid out to Samuel Mc Cleve, Beginning on a white oak near John A Butlers Spring running S 45 W 1/2 S to a chestnut thence N 64 E 1/2 S to a stake on the south line of said Mc Cleve survey thence N 14 E 1/2 S to a stake, thence N 35 W 1/2 S chains to the beginning, being by estimation one hundred and seventeen acres more or less, With all its rights members, hereditaments, appurtenances therein belonging unto or in any wise appertaining, free and clear of any incumbrance therunto, to have and to hold unto the sd Jesse Center to him, his heirs, executors, Adms and assigns forever or against myself, my heirs, executors, Adms or any of them or against any person or persons lawfully claiming or to claim any part thereof.
