Goodlett of Granville County in the State aforesaid in consideration of one dollar to me in hand paid by Ransom Foster of Granville County and State aforesaid and further consideration herein after specified have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Ransom Foster all that tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in Granville County and State aforesaid on a branch waters of South Syger River it being one half of the tract of land whenan Spoutan Goodlett late of Granville County lived Beginning at a Stone 3x near the dry branch and cross thence N 28 1/2 E S 32 1/4 to a stone in the Saluda Gap Road thence along said Road S 7 1/2 E 320 to a stone 3x thence N 31 W 17.95 to a Red oak 3x thence S 79 1/4 E 39.50 to a stone 3x thence S 4 W 36.10 to a Red oak 3x and dead thence N 79 1/2 W 20.40 to a Large white oak 3x and down on branch thence down said branch to a Section 3x thence N 84 W 30.24 to the Beginning containing two hundred and thirty seven acres more or less the further consideration for the covenance of the above described tract of land on that the said Ransom Foster is bound to take his mother in law Mrs. Frances Goodlett unto his home and give her a comfortable support of food and raiment to tract her kindly and give her all necessary attention in sickness during his natural life On this obligation his wife Elizabeth Foster is equally bound with her husband Ransom Foster it is further covenanted that the said Ransom Foster has a right to cultivate and clear land on the tract belonging to Horatio B. Goodlett during Mrs. F. Goodlett's lifetime but not to use timber on said tract except
