Furman on the 20 day of March A.D. 1861 and the deed recorded in the office of the Register Mesne Conveyance in Book 3 page 84 and recorded for the 19th March 1861 Also the following negro slaves viz a man named Toney and his four children Toney, Mary Jetton, our black a negro woman Mary and her three children Joanna, Primus and Phans also a negro woman Sylvan and her child and her brother Richard Also all my Household furniture Glassware silver ware & China ware Also all the notes due me and cash and funds on hand of every description a statement of which is filed with this and certified by me I'm trust nevertheless for the uses intents and purposes hereinafter mentioned namely First in trust that the use next here advantage profits of the land the negroes and other property and the interest of the notes & funds specified shall be allowed and given up to me the said Rebecca Davis during my life Secondly after my decease in trust for the sole and separate use benefit and advantage of my said daughter Mary Glenn Davis Furman free from all debts contracts and liabilities of her present or any future husband Finally In trust that the said James C. Furman or his successors as trustee shall transfer and deliver or up such negroes or any of the other property or notes & funds hereinbefore mentioned to such person or persons as she the said Mary Glenn Davis Furman by her deed or by her last will and Testament shall notwithstanding her coverture direct and appear and in default of such appointment in trust for her issue living at her death and if she should die leaving no such issue then to her heirs according to the Statute of distribution of this State In testimony whereof I the said Rebecca Davis have hereunto affixed my hand and seal March 23rd A.D. 1861

according to the form of his religious belief that his affidavit is true you shall take under his hand and affidant that he was personally present and saw Rebecca Davis sign seal and deliver the deed aforesaid for the uses and intents therein expressed and that he and the other subscribing witness signed their names thereto as witnesses of its due execution which affidavit authenticated under your hands and seals you shall annex to this work And having certified under your hands and seals the due execution of this work and subscribed the same by the oath of one of you before some magistrate who is authorized by the laws of your State to administer oaths and whose official signature may be properly authenticated you shall carefully return this work with your proceedings thereto to the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Greenville County in the State for which aforesaid to be duly recorded.
