State of South Carolina I,	all to whom these presents
or whom the same may in any wise concern I George	shall come or be made known
Seaborn of the County of Anderson in said State send	
Greeting Whereas by his last will and testament the	
late General John R Earle of Silver Glade appointed	
myself and others executors of his last will and	
testament which was admitted to probate in the	
Court of Ordinary of Anderson County on the	
twenty second day of February A.D. 1831 and in	
said last will and testament certain property	
estate was left to his executors to be sold in	
trust for his daughter Georgia Washington Earle	
who subsequently intermarried with one Joseph	
W A Turpin and the heirs of her body which said property	
and estate on the sixth day of March A.D. 1843 consisted	
of a tract of land in the County of Greenville lying	
both sides of the Pincombe road twelve miles from the	
City of Greenville And whereas on that day the said	
Georgia W Turpin filed her complaint against me	
as the sole surviving executor and against each and	
every of the heirs of her body for the sale of said lands	
for good and sufficient reasons and purposes her	
thereto moving And whereas the said cause came	
on to be heard before his Honor Judge Thompson H	
Cooke at Chambers and by a consent order then and there	
by him made of the said George Seaborn was commanded	
to sell at Auction said lands upon certain terms therein	
provided after making such subdivisions as I deemed	
advantageous and at such time and place as I should	
deem desirable And the said lands being subdivided	
after having duly advertised the same for sale at a	
public outcry on said day in November A.D. 1843 before	
the Court House door of Greenville County I did then	
and there publicly and according to the custom of	
Auctions sell and dispose of the said tract of	
land hereinafter described unto Wm E Earle for the	
sum of Two thousand seven hundred and ten Dollars	
being at that price the highest bidder for the same	
Now I now all men that the said George Seaborn in	
in consideration of the premises and also in consideration	
of the premises and the sum of Two thousand seven hundred	
and ten Dollars paid and secured to me in accordance	
with the terms of said order by the said Wm E Earle	
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted	
bargained sold and released and by these presents	
do grant bargain sell and release unto the said	
Wm E Earle his heirs and assigns All that	
tract of land situate in the County of Greenville and	

State aforesaid on both sides of the Pincombe Road and  
Known as the home place of Mrs George W Turpin <sup>and</sup>
