ceipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted  
bargained sold and released, and by these presents  
do grant bargain sell and release unto the said  
Jonathan Smith all that piece, parcel or lot of  
land situate, lying and being in the County of  
Greenville and State aforesaid, on the Anderson  
road about one and a half miles from the City  
of Greenville adjoining lands of Jonathan Smith  
Dr. J. D. Donohue and J. W. Shorting described in  
plat herewith attached containing five acres  
more or less, being a portion of the land deeded  
by O. T. Perry to Fanny P. Beattie on the 20<sup>th</sup>

day of January 1875.
