of the City and County of Greenville, in the state
aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of
Three thousand Dollars to me in hand paid
at and before the sealing of these presents by
Elizabeth Dawson, the receipt whereof is
hereby acknowledged, have granted, but
granted, sold and released and by these
presents do grant, bargain, sell and release
unto the said Elizabeth Dawson all that
certain tract of land situate and lying in
the County and state aforesaid, on the whole
more or less adjoining lands formerly owned
by Mrs A G Beaster, & quels of James E. Bowe
Brown and others, having such shape, with
certain general boundaries as is more fully
set forth in a deed of conveyance from Eliza-
beth Bowe to me the said Sallie Earle.

bearing date the 6th day of December A.D. 1813
and recorded in Office of Register of Mesne
Conveyances for the County aforesaid in
