I, G. W. Taylor, of the City and County of Greenville and State of South Carolina,

in the State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of \$10,000.00 Dollars, to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by M. J. Miller and Steely E. Ellis,

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said M. J. Miller and Steely E. Ellis all of my rights and interest in said lot, in County and State being a part of the town aforesaid, now lying in the Charleston, Western Carolina Railway by deed recorded in the Register of Deeds of Greenville County on the 1st day of August, A.D. 1904, at five years, and hath been running north and south, beginning at the corner of my office rooms and a Restaurant which corner is on the line between my lot and the right of way of the railway, bounded on the west by a street from the corner, made by said line and the line of the north side of Washington Street, one hundred and twenty feet long, running thence east along Washington Street and my line, 9' 3" 1/2' wide, thirty feet to a corner on the corner of the N.W. corner of said building, thence N. 3' 1/2' E. One hundred and twenty feet to a corner on Good Street, thence S. 3' 1/2' E. thirty feet to a corner, thence N. 3' 1/2' W. One hundred and twenty feet to the beginning corner of the left next to the principal station of the Southern Railroad, being (covered by the foundation) of the Old Restaurant building. It is not the purpose of this deed to convey any rights or appurtenances to my property, abutting on either side of the above lot.

TOGETHER with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the said premises before mentioned, unto the said M. J. Miller and Steely E. Ellis, Heirs and Assigns forever.

And I do hereby bind myself, my self, my self, Heirs, Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular, the said premises unto the said M. J. Miller and Steely E. Ellis.

Heirs and Assigns, against me and my self, Heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
