(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said John W. Walker, all undivided interest and estate they now have or hold in and unto all the land of John W. Walker, of more or less one acre and three rods of land containing three and one-half acres, more or less private, lying and being in the County and State aforesaid about 6 miles South of Greenville County, known as the White Horse Road and having the following mates, bounds and bearing to west, beginning at old oak 370 m. and running thence S. 58 E. 10 ft. 1/16 of a stone 370 m. then S. 27 E. 10 ft. 80 ft. 9 stones 370 m. thence N. 84 E. 7 ft. 10 ft. 9 stones 370 m. on John W. Walker's line, thence N. 2 E. 4 ft. 80 ft. to the beginning and adjoining lands of John W.
