Jordan, All that piece of land situated in Greenville, being one hundred and forty acres containing One Hundred and Sixty Acres more or less, lying on Main Street, bordering on Saluda River and on the East Side of said land and being bounded on the west by the following roads and boundaries and distances to w<sup>t</sup>th, Beginning on a stone and running thence N. 67° W. 183.60 ft. to stone fence N. 136° S. 50 ft. to stone, thence S. 67° W. 3500 ft. to stone, thence S. 67° W. 3500 ft. to stone, thence N. 67° E. 1000 ft. to stone, thence N. 45° E. 1000 ft. to 100' Oak Creek stone S. 63° E. 100 ft. to stone fence S. 22° W. 18.80 ft. to beginning stone, and bounded by borders of W.
