(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said J. D. Freeman, All that piece of land, situated being and being and situated in Greenville County and State of South Carolina, the south side of the State Road leading from the City of Greenville to Spartanburg, about five miles from Greenville, S. C., containing Thirty Three (33) acres more or less, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit, and distinctly so shown by a plat of the same made by Augustus O. Dugayt, Surveyor, on the 25th day of October 1891, to wit, beginning at a rock on the Sparta Road, and running thence S. 17° E. 18.15 T. Run on the Birmingham's line, thence S. 43° E. 10.73 S. 43° E. 10.73 to a rock on the line, thence N. 45° E. 16.80 along the line of P. S. Lovell's (now Birmingham's) to a rock on the Birmingham's line, thence S. 74° E. 15.25 to a rock formerly on the Birmingham's line N. 0.3 E. 11.35 along the Sparta Road to the beginning corner of the cornering off part of the tract of land, known by William Moore, Mary Moore, Martha Smith, Godfrey, John, James, Myra, and Jefferson Headware, by deed bearing date the 4th day of August 1873, and executed by them to Amos D. Freeman, by deed bearing date the 1st day of 1889, pro verschied, and sealed in book, page 61, and by said Amos D. Freeman to W. M. Freeman by W. M. Freeman to him, and W. H. Bailey to Amos D. Heirs and Assigns, against me and my wife, Heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
